

## BASIC GRID FORMS

Many designers consider some prefabricated placement of their text, shapes, and visual objects. They may use these forms, especially with text.

### O-Forms

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given. White space is allowed where the white portions are present.


The O-Form allows the reader to see the most prominent object and text in the center of the page. The object may be surrounded by other objects or may use white space. Some people call this form the "donut" form, since some conclude it resembles a donut or a donut-hole.

## L-Forms

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given.  
White space is allowed where the white portions are present.


The L-Form allows you to place headers or rules at the top or the bottom of the page. Most of the text of a page should be left-aligned.


## T-Forms

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given.  
White space is allowed where the white portions are present.


The T-Form allows you to place headers or rules at the top or the bottom of the page. Most of the text of a page should be center-aligned.


**E-Form**

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given.  
White space is allowed where the white portions are present.


**C-Form**

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given.  
White space is allowed where the white portions are present.


**F-Form**

Information appears on the page where the shaded portions are given.
