

## BIBLIOGRAPHIC CITATIONS (MLA)

*With MLA Bibliographic Citations, you simply find the corresponding format/form which matches the source you are using. For example, if you are using a reading from your textbook, then you should select the MLA Bibliographic Citation format/form for SELECTIONS IN AN ANTHOLOGY. Using the source, put all of the information you can find into the corresponding format/form, then place the citation on your Works Cited page.*

### PRINT DOCUMENTS

#### 1. BOOKS

Last Name, First Name. *Title* [italicized]. City of Publication: Press Name, Year of Publication. Print.

EX:

Galas, Brad. *An Anthropological Investigation of Southern Utahns*. New York: Greenfield Press, 2010. Print.

##### 1.1. *Two Authors*

Last Name, First Name and Last Name, First Name.

##### 1.2. *Three Authors*

Last Name, First Name, Last Name, First Name, and Last Name, First Name.

##### 1.3. *More Than Three Authors*

Use the abbreviation et al. following the Last Name, First Name of the first author (EX: Miller, Tyler, et al.)

##### 1.4. *No Author*

Use the title in place of the author's name.

##### 1.5. *Corporate or Group Authors*

Use the entire name of the corporate or group author.

#### 2. EDITED BOOK OR ANTHOLOGY

Last Name, First Name, ed. *Title* [italicized]. City of Publication: Press Name, Year of Publication. Print.

Note: Use ed. for single editors. Use eds. for two or more editors.

EX:

Hellman, Angela, ed. *Religious Turmoil: An Introspection of Race in the Evangelical Church*. Portsmouth: Eco Press, 2009. Print.

3. A SELECTION FROM AN ANTHOLOGY OR EDITED COLLECTION  
(A COLLECTION OF LETTERS, SHORT STORIES, POETRY, OR ESSAYS)

Last Name, First Name [of the shorter work - article, essay, or poem]. Title of the shorter work [in quotation marks]. Title of the Longer Work [italicized]. Ed. First Name [then] Last Name. City of Publication: Press Name, Year of Publication. Page Numbers. Print.

Page numbering when continuous is number to number.  
EX: 114-128

Page numbering when broken is number comma number.  
EX: 74, 123

Note: When no author is given, move the title [in quotation marks] into its place.

4. A BOOK WITH A TRANSLATOR

Last Name, First Name. Title [Italicized]. Trans. [Put the translator's name here First Name and then Last Name]. City of Publication: Press Name, Year of Publication. Print.

EX:

DeGorges, Armand. *Phronesis*. Trans. Sarah Riggins. New Haven: Port Press, 2011. Print.

5. JOURNAL ARTICLE

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. *Title of Journal* [italicized]. Volume Number. Issue Number (Year of Publication): Pages. Print.

EX:

Day, Sarah. "Children of Working Mothers." *Journal of Health and Urban Development*. 5.1 (2014): 27-38. Print.

6. ARTICLE IN A MONTHLY MAGAZINE

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. *Title of Magazine* [italicized]. Abbreviated Month. Year of Publication: Pages. Print.

EX:

Cordoba, Alissa. "Finding New Energy Sources." *Scientific Entrepreneur Quarterly*. Apr. 2010: 47-49. Print.

7. ARTICLE IN A WEEKLY MAGAZINE

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. *Title of Magazine* [italicized]. Day. Abbreviated Month. Year of Publication: Pages. Print.

EX:

Meyers, Gregory. "Giving Everything to Family." *Healthy Living Monthly*. Mar. 2010: 39-48, 101.

#### 8. ARTICLE IN THE NEWSPAPER

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. *Title of Newspaper* [italicized]. Abbreviated Day Month Year of Publication. Pages. Print.

EX:

Marx, Roger. "Recovering from Recession: A Long Haul." *The Wall Street Voice*. 20 June 2011. A3. Print.

#### 9. ABSTRACT (ARTICLE, BOOK, DISSERTATION, OR THESIS)

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Work [italicized]. Identify if the text: Article, Book, Dissertation, or Thesis [Put the word]. Location or University, Year of Publication or Completion. Source [Name the database or index containing the abstract]. Print.

EX:

Valentino, Melissa. *Plasmid Change in Tuberculosis*. Dissertation. Pacific Technological University. Dissertations and Theses. Print.

#### 10. PAMPHLET OR BROCHURE

Title of the Pamphlet [Italicized]. City of Publication: Name of the Corporation or Organization, Year of Publication. Print.

EX:

*Heart Health and Wellness*. Tampa: American Cardiology Association, 2011. Print.

### *ELECTRONIC DOCUMENTS*

Advice:

Always cite any information you can find, since some information will be difficult to find.

#### 1. ONLINE SITE, HOMEPAGE, OR ONLINE TEXT.

Last Name, First Name [use name only if found]. Title of the site [italicized]. Name of sponsoring organization or institution. Date of publication or most recent update. Web. Date of access or view. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Norris, Tom. *Fish Species of Arizona*. Society of Northern Arizona Fisherman. Winter 2010. Web. 14 August 2011. <<http://www.fsarizona.org/fishspecies>>.

Notes:

- +When URL's are longer, you may split them at the slash [/] to fit the lines appropriately.
- +When no date is given, you may write N.D. (n.d.).
- +Always enclose Uniform Resource Locators or Online Addresses in Arrow Point Brackets < >.

## 2. ONLINE SITE WITH A SHORT ARTICLE OR INFORMATION PAGE.

Last Name, First Name [use name only if found]. Short Title [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Title of the page/site [italicized]. Name of sponsoring organization or institution. Date of publication or most recent update [Day Month Year]. Web. Date of access or view [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Lennox, Jerry. "Working with Plastics." Plastic Construction. Materials and Construction Omnisite. Spring 2009. Web. 19 April 2010.

## 3. ONLINE BOOK

Last Name, First Name. *Title* [italicized]. Owner of the Site or the name of sponsoring organization or institution. Date of publication or most recent update [Day Month Year]. Web. Date of access or view [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Freeman, Kevin. *Constructing Sustainable Shelters*. Housing for the Homeless. July 2009. Web. 12 November 2009.

## 4. ONLINE JOURNAL ARTICLE

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Name of Sponsoring Site or Periodical Publication [italicized], Date of publication or most recent update [Day Month Year]. Web. Access Date [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Goody, Mary. "Interior Design and the Muslim World." *Interior Design Quarterly*, 11 March 2009. Web. 17 October 2010. <<http://www.idq.com/designmuslimworld>>

## 5. ONLINE IMAGE

Last Name, First Name. Title [italicized]. Date Created or Date Published [Day Month Year]. Location. Web. Access Date [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Williams, Ted. *On the Grand Canyon*. 14 January 2008. Web. 20 March 2010. <<http://www.tedwilliamsimagery.com/grandcanyon>>.

## 6. ONLINE ARTICLE FROM A DATABASE

Last Name, First Name. Title of the Article [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Name of Periodical [italicized]. Date of publication [Day Month Year]: Pages. Name of Database. Name of Subscription Service [if available]. Web. Access Date [day month year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Clark, Mary. "Science and Sin: The Atheist Argument." *American Myth: A Journal of Culture and Folklore* May 2010: 29-32. Academic Search Basic. Eduhost. Web. 4 September 2010.

## 7. ONLINE POSTINGS (GROUP/LISTSERV/NEWSGROUP)

Last Name, First Name. Title from the Subject Heading [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Online Posting [written as is]. Name of newsgroup or group or listserv. Date of posting [Day Month Year]. Web. Access Date [Day month year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Wiser, Kimberly. "Why Men Cheat." Online Posting. Askaboutmen.org. 14 November 2012. Web. 24 December 2012.

## 8. ONLINE POSTING (BLOG)

Last Name, First Name. Title of Entry [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Name of the Sponsor of the Blog [italicized]. Date of entry [Day Month Year]. Web. Access Date [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Petersen, Trisha. "Walking into a Phoenician Desert." *BloggerXL*. 26 July 2009. Web. 9 March 2010.

## 9. ONLINE CLIP (AUDIO OR VIDEO CLIPS)

Last Name, First Name. Title [italicized]. Name of Host [e.g. YouTube, Google Video, iTunes, MP3. com - italicized]. Date of posting, publication, or performance [Day Month Year]. Web. Access Date [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

Armstrong, Kelly. *Quite Ripe*. YouTube. 14 April 2009. Web. 23 March 2010.

## 10. WIKI

"Keyword." Name of Wiki [italicized]. [Name of Owner/Group]. Date of posting, publication, or performance [Day Month Year]. Web. Access Date [Day Month Year]. <Uniform Resource Locator or online address> [optional].

EX:

“Cenobio Hernandez.”

## *NON-PRINT DOCUMENTS*

### 1. GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS

Author or Group Name [Last Name, First Name for individual authors]. Department or Agency Name. Title [italicized]. City of Publication [if applicable]. Year of Publication. Print.

### 2. DISSERTATION OR THESIS

Last Name, First Name. Title [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Type [write either Diss for dissertation or Thesis for thesis]. The Name of the University, College, or School. Year of Completion. Print.

### 3. IMAGES, ARTWORK, AND ADVERTISEMENTS

Name of the Author, Agency, or Business [for individuals, use Last Name, First Name]. Title of Work [if applicable, italicized]. Type [you should specify the type of work: Painting, Advertisement, Photograph, etc.]. Name of Sponsor or host. Location [if applicable]. Year of creation or publication. Print.

### 4. AUDIO TRACKS, MUSICAL COMPOSITIONS, OR SONGS

Last Name, First Name [give the musicians name]. Title [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Recording Label [if applicable]. Date Created or Date Published.

### 5. TELEVISION OR RADIO PROGRAMS

Episode Name [in quotation marks]. Name of Writer. Name of Director. Name of Television or Radio Program. Name of the TV Station or Radio Network. Year of presentation. [Specify whether TV, DVD, Radio, or Web].

### 6. FILMS

Name of the Film. Name of the Director. Name of the Distributor or Production Company. Year of presentation. [Specify Whether DVD, VHS, or Other]

### 7. LECTURES, SPEECHES, OR PUBLIC ADDRESS

Last Name, First Name. Title of Speech, Address, or Lecture [in quotation marks with all appropriate words capitalized]. Name of event, course, or other context [if applicable]. Location. Date [day month year]. [Specify Whether Performance, Lecture, Speech, Web, or Other]

## 8. INTERVIEWS

Last Name, First Name. Personal Interview [written as is]. Date [day month year].

EX:

Winters, Paula. Personal Interview. 12 April 2010.
